
Mission Statement

- Support division heads in issues related to student behavior, parents, and personnel when needed;
- Manage the School's master calendar;
- Attend school activities and maintain an open-door policy with all constituents;
- Serve as a member of the senior leadership team reporting to the head of school; and
- Teach one class.
